

Church Services in the benefice

In light of the Government guidance around non-essential contact, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York have issued advice that public worship is suspended until further notice.

Buxhall church will be open as usual but no public worship services will be taking place.

Local Radio Live Service on Sunday mornings

The BBC has announced that it is broadcasting a church service on Sunday mornings across every local radio station in England beginning Sunday 22 March and led by the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, as part of its response to the Coronavirus crisis. There is also a plan to broadcast a weekly Sunday morning service on BBC.



He gave us a fascinating talk on the techniques used by those real enthusiasts who produce the amazing large headed Chrysanthemums at the autumn shows. The timed stopping of the shoots was the least of it. Each bloom has each petal tweaked by the judicious use of two matchsticks or cotton buds to ensure they all lie in the same direction. He also brought us a wonderful selection of goodies to browse through, from bare root roses, perennials, bulbs and dahlia tubers as well as some highly covetable gardening hardware.

Unfortunately, in the light of the current situation and regarding the latest government advice, it has been decided to cancel meetings for both April and May. Buses I have spoken to the community bus service and told them that I will put in an application to my locality fund for £1,000 if they will agree to continue the service to Buxhall. As a result they have agreed to continue.

Grass and verge cutting schedule I have sent this to the Parish Council.

Mid Suffolk Locality Fund I have put in two applications for funding: £500 for the play area and £3500 for a new Vehicle Activated Sign.

Budget The Mid Suffolk Council setting meeting took place last week. The Lib Dems and Green party members put forward some amendments including more highways support for planning, investment in making all new housing zero carbon, install electric charging points in all public car parks, to have free parking in Stowmarket after 3.00pm one day per week and to have a competition to produce plans for a series of sustainable Suffolk house designs.

However on rises for council tenant rents and charges for sheltered housing (which I voted against) it seems there was a mistake by one Conservative councillor and also the chair when the votes were taken so this cannot be implemented until legal advice has been taken!

Disabled Facilities Grants I have met with the officer to see what is happening with these and the current contract, I am hoping these will be taken over completely by the district council.

Youth Council My suggestion of a youth council has been taken up.



News from your District Councillor - Penny Otton

Review of school transport policy implementation highlights failings
Suffolk County Council has undertaken an internal review of the implementation of its new school transport policy. The report from the review group identified 19 failings and was discussed by the Scrutiny Committee on 12 February.

The report highlighted a number of concerns including: that there were insufficient staff numbers to cope with the increased workload; the policy was poorly communicated to parents and schools and the application and appeals processes were too complex. The Scrutiny Committee has agreed to review the policy itself before the end of 2020.

2020-21 budget agreed

On 13 February, the Council agreed the budget for 2020-21. This included a council tax rise of 3.98%, a £3m "Suffolk 2020 Fund", and a £0.5m Highways Investment Fund. Both opposition groups proposed amendments to the budget. Our amendment included additional funding for health visitors, increasing social worker salaries, investment in electric vehicle charging infrastructure and increasing funding to Citizens Advice and to re-introduce bus passes for carers. Unfortunately, these amendments were voted down by the Conservative administration.

Plans for Ipswich Northern Route are scrapped

The Cabinet at Suffolk County Council has voted to end any further work on an Ipswich Northern Route. This decision follows the withdrawal of support for the Northern Route from a number of district councils.

The Cabinet has instead agreed to set-up a taskforce to look at alternative measures for dealing with transport issues in Ipswich. It is not yet clear who will be on the taskforce, when it will be set up or what its remit will be.

Streelitghts to change to LED in bid to save money and carbon

The Cabinet has agreed to invest £9.8m in converting all council-owned streetlights in Suffolk to LED bulbs, with the capability for dimming by up to 50%. This level of investment could potentially be returned through energy savings within 5.5 years of completed conversion, if no dimming was applied and assuming energy costs increase at a rate of 8%. If dimming is applied, there would be a return on investment within 4 years. It is also expected to reduce carbon emissions by between 60-80%.

The council is hoping to begin the work in autumn 2020, and expects the project to be completed within two years.





FINBOROUGH COMMUNITY CINEMA

The Little Ernie Lottery - fundraising for Buxhall Village Hall

Dear Fellow Villager,

The Little Ernie Lottery has successfully raised much needed funds for the village hall for over 25 years. Monies have been used in three main ways: profits have contributed to the overall running and maintenance costs of the building; they have helped to maintain a contingency fund should anything major happen to the structure and its contents; and finally have assisted with new purchases for hall use. This year new LED lighting will be installed throughout the hall improving lighting whilst reducing power usage. The Committee are also in the process of obtaining quotes for refurbishment of the kitchen and hope to progress this during 2020.

Please continue to help the village by supporting the Little Ernie Lottery. It helps keep the village hall going which plays an important role in our community, providing a centre for social and sporting activities.

Q: How does it work? A: Very simply! Annual subscriptions are available at £6 per entry- with **no limit** imposed per household or per person—although all entrants must be over 16*. Each subscription received is allocated a number, and ten monthly draws (June to March) are held per year with three prizes, **£30, £20 and £10 being awarded. Winnings are doubled for the Grand Christmas draw in December. Winners are drawn monthly in public at a village event and announced in the Buxhall Broadcast. Prizes are paid by cheque and delivered directly to the winners.

***The law stipulates that children under 16 are not allowed to directly participate- so all entries must be in an adult's name. Your signature at time of entry is taken as evidence that you and all lottery subscribers applied for are over 16.**

****Please note: prize levels are dependent on a subscription level of 200 participants. In the event of a smaller number of participants, payment may have to be scaled back—although the chances of winning will remain as great. Last year an extra bonus was added at the discretion of the Management Committee due to the fantastic take up.**
