

From the Rectory



What's been happening... An isolated home in the village has been targeted with a rear door being forced open to gain entry. There was an untidy search and a number of items were stolen.

Generally... Spring and its new lease of life will eventually arrive and we will all be busy in our gardens. Just give a thought to the security of homes and sheds during the day and don't assume that whilst you are making that well-earned cup of tea or digging at the bottom of your back garden that your unlocked or open windows & doors to homes & sheds or garage are safe from prying eyes!

Tackling Rural Crime... Officers have been allocated to tackle offenders who target farms and rural communities. Rural crime comes in many different forms ranging from offences against wildlife, such as hare coursing, theft of fuels including diesel and heating oils and stealing metal. Police are strengthening their response to those who commit these crimes by introducing a new team of Special Constables who will work in the Mid-Suffolk area. It is hoped this will not only help catch criminals but develop methods for preventing rural crime in the first place. The initiative has been launched as a direct response to concerns rose by farmers and residents in rural areas and has seen police working closely with the Country Land and Business Association.

Bike Safety Course offer... In conjunction with Suffolk County Council, we are running a series of workshops to decrease the number of motorcyclists killed or seriously injured. In 2012, 6 motorcyclists were killed on Suffolk's country roads, and 8 in 2011. This workshop is suitable for qualified riders regardless of experience. Sessions run from 7pm on a Friday evening and 9am on Saturday, starting in March and held at Police headquarters in Martlesham Heath. Cost £55. 

Places available in Councils' Sheltered Housing Schemes

Babergh & Mid Suffolk District Councils are keen to attract new applicants to their sheltered housing. Many people may not even realise that they qualify.

Sheltered housing offers older people the opportunity to retain their independence in a flat of their own and have the security of knowing that there is a scheme manager to check up on them every week day.

Sue Lister, the Councils' Corporate Manager - Supported Housing, said: "Anyone over 60 is able to apply for sheltered housing. People opt for our sheltered housing for many reasons, such as wanting to move closer to their family, but at the same time retain their independence.

"Many people enjoy the companionship of living with others of a similar age and at the same time not have the worry of managing a home and a garden. All schemes have alarms for residents to summon help in an emergency at any time of the day or night.

"We welcome applications from all sectors of the community. Even if you do not think you qualify but would like some advice, our team is happy to answer your questions."

All sheltered accommodation is self contained. The larger schemes are made up of individual flats with communal facilities such as a laundry, lounge and guest rooms. Other schemes have bungalows with a communal lounge. There are often social activities organised by the residents.

Another factor for opting for sheltered housing is affordability. Charges vary but are typically about £100 a week including service charges, utilities and support costs.

Across the two district areas, there are sheltered housing schemes in many villages and towns including Lavenham, Long Melford, Nayland, Hadleigh, Sudbury, Stowmarket, Eye, Elmswell and Needham Market. In addition there are two very sheltered schemes at Sydney Brown Court, Hadleigh and William Wood House, Sudbury.




