

From the Ministry Team

This is mid-November and the annual round of 'what do you want for Christmas?' has started. It is always encouraging that someone wants to buy you something but how that simple and well meant phrase helps us get the whole concept of giving and receiving the wrong way round. Wellmeaning because it prevents waste and provide the recipient with something they actually want but wrong because it puts the pressure on that recipient to think up something that they want and make a difficult guess at how much will be spent. It distorts the idea that the giver is thinking of something that will give the recipient pleasure and that is the whole point of giving. 'Never look a gift horse in the mouth' is a well worn phrase – many people do and come unstuck I fear by expecting too much or suffering the boredom of knowing what is to come let alone the hassle of the thinking it up in the first place. And oh, the joylessness of 'we don't bother giving to each other anymore' -Christmas is just another day.

Frequently Christ is regarded as a gift to the world, yet, as says the famous reading from John, 'The world knew him not'. The world did not want anyone like that who would upset their conventions and laws. The Jews looked for a messiah it is true but not one who would overturn their regulations and end up crucified as a common criminal. They wanted one who would let their nation rule the world where they would be the rulers too. The disciples had enough trouble working out who would sit at the right and the left.

Sometimes the gifts we receive from others are a bit like that. The socks we don't like, the exercise bicycle given with an ulterior motive – let alone the cordless drill, cookery book or new food processor, but sometimes they are good for us. Christ has been a good present for the world. We live in a society shaped by Christianity with its care for all embodied in the welfare state founded on Christian principles: we send peacemakers out, we send millions in aid to those less fortunate. Our churches provide invaluable assistance and charity monies. Christ has been a good present for the world and us. Come and join us and give thanks and cheer - there is plenty of scope: services all over with different styles and moods. An unwelcome present to the world at the time but what wonders have since been done in his name

I join with all the Ministry Team in wishing you a happy Christmas and good New Year. May all that you give and receive be good.

Toilet Twinning



Buxhall's church toilet is now officially twinned with a latrine in Cambodia! But what is toilet twinning?

About 40% of the world's population don't have somewhere safe, clean and hygienic to go to the loo. The human impact of this statistic is enormous: nearly one in five child deaths each year is due to diarrhoea. For people in poor communities, a hole in the ground is quite literally a life saver – protecting women from the risk of attack as they find somewhere private to squat, and shielding children from preventable diarrhoeal diseases—every minute, three children under the age of five die because of dirty water and poor sanitation.

A donation of £60 for the twinning goes to the charities Cord and Tearfund who use the money raised to enable operational teams and local partners to work with local communities in Africa and Asia to build thousands of latrines around the world. Many of these communities also receive education about domestic hygiene and access to clean water. This means better sanitation, clean water and hygiene education – helping people enjoy better health, go to school and work, and ultimately, begin to flush away poverty.

Buxhall PCC has now twinned our toilet with one in Chhuksaw Village, near to the Cambodian/Vietnamese border. Cambodia is one of the poorest countries in Asia. 1 in 3 people live below the national poverty line, surviving on less than 50 US cents per day and only 1 in 3 people in Cambodia have a loo. This means people are forced to go in the open which affects the health of the community and their animals – often a main source of income, especially for people living in rural areas.

We thought that this was such a good idea, we're having two special collections at services in the New Year, on 13 and 20 January, to raise money to twin with another toilet (or £240 buys a school toilet block!)

Hello everyone,

What's happening in the area...

Rattlesden - a vehicle left parked on a residential drive on Top Road was stolen and later discovered abandoned by police at a field on Rattlesden Road, Buxhall. The contents of the car had been stolen.

Anti Social Behaviour complaints over Halloween...

Suffolk Police Community Safety produced figures around Halloween this year and found that only 6% of recorded ASBs were attributed to the period. Safer Neighbourhood teams in the area were patrolling over this period and working with shops, schools and residents in the area to encourage respect for those not wishing to participate in the event, and to promote the enjoyment in a positive, safe way.

Police Tractor visits Rattlesden Primary School...

Pupils at Rattlesden Primary School got the opportunity to explore the marked police tractor earlier this month by winning a 'Design your ideal police tractor' competition. With backing from Ernest Doe at Marlesford and Case IH, the tractor has helped get an important rural crime reduction messages out to communities. The company provided Suffolk Constabulary with a Case tractor, free of charge, to assist police in raising the profile of steps that can be taken to prevent rural crime within the county. Police launched a new booklet 'Shutting the gate on rural crime' designed to give advice to land and home owners on measures that can be taken to protect property in rural locations. One pupil, Sam Parker, was presented a special edition Britain's model of the tractor on the day and was lucky enough to actually drive the machine itself! 

Speeding near Finborough Primary School

I have been sent an item regarding traffic speed at the top of the Buxhall road, on the approach to where it joins the High road in Finborough:

"This stretch of road is within the 20 mile an hour school zone. However, the vast majority of the traffic travels along this road at speeds far in excess of this, which presents people with problems trying to cross over with children, as they walk them to the primary school and back. There are also several driveways along this stretch, with limited visibility due to the curvature of the road. When vehicles come up the hill going too fast, it is very difficult to pull off those drives safely.

After speaking to the council and asking for clearer signage of the school zone 20mph limit, they have moved the sign (from behind a tree) to the opposite side of the road where it is more visible. Please could we remind everyone heading towards Great Finborough on the Buxhall road that the 30mph zone starts at the bottom of the hill, before the houses, and then changes to a 20mph zone a little further on up the hill, as per the new sign."

Neighbourhood Watch

Operation Drawbridge launched to deter burglaries during the winter months

'Protect your House' and 'Help us catch the burglar', these are the messages from Suffolk Police as they launched 'Operation Drawbridge'. The Operation is aimed at reducing the number of house burglaries in the county. The campaign aims to reduce the number of these offences by encouraging homeowners to take simple measures to protect their house, and to increase the amount of crimes 'solved' by asking the public to provide police with crucial information to help bring those responsible to justice. As darkness now descends earlier in the day, homeowners are reminded to light up their homes and deter would-be burglars.

Tackling burglary is a key priority for police. Despite latest figures showing a 15% drop in this type of crime, the distress and upset it causes victims means that it remains a top concern. For further details see news stories under news and events on www.suffolk.police.uk.

Please don't give burglars an easy ride

Police in Suffolk are urging residents to keep car keys out of view in their homes following a spate of burglaries involving the theft of keys and subsequent theft of motor vehicles. As part of Operation Drawbridge, police are reminding all to take this simple step and stop giving burglars access to vehicles. Not only are offenders gaining access to people's homes and stealing their possessions, but also going one step further and taking keys so that they may steal vehicles. If burglars have managed to get inside a home, it is essential that they are not offered 'easy pickings':

- Valuable items, cash and jewellery should be kept out of view, and secured if possible, and keys should not be left in obvious places.
- Do not leave keys near to windows and doors, as burglars will often target these directly, quickly gaining access.
- Considering fitting a letterbox cage or restrictor which prevents burglars from putting their hands or gadgets through the letterbox and trying the latches from the inside.
- Don't leave keys on 'key holders' or similar with labels explaining what they are for, and avoid leaving them hanging in keyholes.
- Fit a burglar alarm, but make sure it is installed by a company that is registered with SSAIB or NSI and is fitted to BS EN50131.
