#### From the Rectory

10 May 2016 was a significant day in the life of the Christian community in Stowmarket as it saw the official opening of the first new Church of England School in the Diocese for over 40 years and the first ever in Stowmarket. Trinity CEVAP School has 41 pupils and another 30 are expected in September from which we expect it will grow to over 300, filling the magnificent facilities of the former Combs Middle School. Bishop Martin, the Mayor of Stowmarket, local headteachers and other dignitaries engaged with the children for a memorable opening service in the school.

The night before I attended Great Finborough Parish Annual Meeting to hear reports on village activities and organisations. The Chair of Governors of Finborough Primary Church School , Mr Jamie Warner, explained how it was significantly oversubscribed because of its outstanding reputation for academic and spiritual development, as well as the opportunities it gives children for sport and outdoor activities. Very well done to Mr Stephen Dodd at Great Finborough and Mrs Linda Curran Spain at Trinity, who with their teams give our children a remarkably good start in these two church sponsored schools.

The Revd Rachel and I visit them both regularly and we remember when access to schools was easy – no security pads, buzzers and intercoms – but barriers and boundaries seem to be more integral to our lives than ever before. One of the set readings for Rogation Sunday on 1 May was from Paul's second Letter to the church in Thessalonica (2 Thessalonians ch 3 v6-13) which talks about how important good relationships are but how easily they go awry. Interestingly the last teaching Jesus gave us was to love one another, a gift of peace. And for there to be peace we need to know our boundaries and roles. Rogation Sunday was traditionally the time when parishes marked their boundaries to ensure all knew their responsibilities – who said high hedges make good neighbours?

There are good boundaries, like those placed round marriages to help and support, round children and vulnerable adults and there are those that demark areas of responsibility in our civil and church life. But there are bad boundaries too, like those that make this group or organisation,



#### **Buxhall Produce Show 2016**

Buxhall Produce Show will be held this year on Saturday 27 August at Buxhall Village Hall. Below is the recipe for the one of the cakes which in case all the bakers out there want to try the recipe before the Show.

#### Upside Down Gingerbread and Pear Cake

Ingredients:

300g plain flour	60g brown sugar		
1½ teaspoons bicarbonate of soda	2 (415g) tins pear halves in		
2 teaspoons ground cinnamon	syrup, well drained		
2 teaspoons ground ginger	100g caster sugar		
1 teaspoon ground cloves	120g butter, softened		
½ teaspoon salt	1 egg		
60g butter	235ml treacle		
	235ml hot water		

#### Method

Preheat oven to 180°C/Gas 4. In a bowl, lightly mix the flour, bicarbonate of soda, cinnamon, ginger, cloves and salt until thoroughly combined.

Place the 60g of butter into a 25cm loose bottomed or spring form baking tin; place in the oven and allow to melt for a minute or two. Sprinkle brown sugar over the melted butter. Pat the pear halves dry with kitchen paper, and cut each half into 3 slices lengthways. Arrange the pear slices in a spiral pattern on top of the brown sugar. Without disturbing the arranged pears, lightly grease the inside of the tin to prevent sticking later.

Beat the caster sugar and 120g of soft butter in a mixing bowl with an electric mixer until creamy; beat in the egg, then mix in the treacle. Mix the flour mixture into the treacle mixture, then stir in the hot water. Pour the cake mixture into the tin on top of the pear slices.

Bake the cake in the preheated oven until a knife inserted into the cake comes out clean, about 45 to 50 minutes.

Allow to cool completely before inverting on a serving dish and removing the baking tin.

**NB** Some tins may need lining to avoid the butter and brown sugar mixture leaking.
