Great Finborough and District Garden Club

What a muddle of a winter it has been, the weather doesn't seem to have made up its mind what sort of a winter we should have had, but spring is on the way!!

The start of the new Garden Club year was the meeting on 12 February, when an illustrated talk was given by Andrew Wilkinson from Triffid Nurseries on the subject of carnivorous plants. He presented these fascinating plants in a whole new light and converted many of those present into potential owners, at least as a passive and relatively simple to keep method of fly control. One which will not involve rolled newspapers, electric racquets or plastic swatters.

Keep a watch on your aquilegias, a new and lethal variety of downy mildew is decimating these staple cottage garden plants and there is no method of control or cure other than uprooting and destruction by fire or in the council composting. Your own compost heap does not reach a high enough temperature to do the job and so will spread the mildew through the rest of your plants. This mildew has already been found in Essex as well as other counties throughout the UK so be aware!!

The next meeting in the Pettiward Hall, on Thursday 12 March at 7.30 pm, will be a talk by Tim Fuller of the Plantsman's Preference on the subject of "Grasses".

From the Rectory

I noted that Candlemas Day (2 February) was indeed dry and bright so 'winter may have another bite'. It did later that week. These old country sayings do have some sense in them but today with central heating, heated car seats and the like we can move seamlessly from one comfort zone to another whatever the weather— not so our forebears— not so many people in our world.

The shame and horror across the world that some people continue to kill others or make their lives more difficult is hard for us to comprehend. But in days gone by we in this land weren't always *kind* to one another. The Patronal Festival at Shelland at the end of January had us with Bishop David remembering the murder of our King, for standing for what he believed in. Other Christians put him to death. Christians have behaved abominably towards each other in the past which we do well to remember when condemning those of other faiths. And it isn't just abominable behaviour, sometimes just uncharitable unloving actions and attitudes that reach into our lifetimes have caused much hurt. Perhaps lastly legalised was the Workhouse system, its representative standing sentinel as it does high on Onehouse Hill, but for many centuries thankfully we have not killed or maimed in the name of some creed or belief system, though we could have done better to love...

It is right then that as Lent approaches our churches are turning their attention once again with renewed vigour to helping others who still suffer. St Andrew's Coffee Mornings do this monthly and almost all our churches are organising events as you can see to support and do God's work. Ebola, Ethiopiaid, Christian Aid all feature. Will you come and help us?

My God doesn't call me to persecute others, my God calls me to encourage and support that which is good and I hope you feel able to support that work too through the church or otherwise.

The church exists to be useful to its community and wider, to show love and care and concern. It does not exist for itself and its own interest groups. We want to show love breaking through as did God at Easter.

So what's happening in the area over the last month?

There have been 19 thefts from allotment sheds in Mid Suffolk since 1 October 2014 and 14 crimes in the area of Redgrave, Botesdale and Rickinghall since 1 Jan 2015. The crime is varied in nature, however bicycles and motorbikes are being targeted, as well as garden items such as plant pots. Attention is being given to the area at the key times.

Elmswell and surrounding villages have been subjected to dwelling burglaries where offenders' entry is gained by forcing a PVC window to the rear of property, carrying out untidy searches with jewellery and cash being targeted.

Guidance and reassurance is being given by Suffolk Constabulary during visits to Post Offices and convenience stores in relation to recent robberies and attempted robberies in the area, Essex has also been targeted.

Crime Reduction advice

Sheds have been targeted recently both at residential properties and on community allotments. Criminals are tempted by the equipment stored within then including hand tools, power tools, lawn mowers, bicycles and fishing equipment. Sheds are usually poorly secured, or indeed left insecure making them an ideal target for the opportunistic thief. A few simple steps however can help keep your equipment safe while deterring thieves. Suffolk Police are therefore urging everyone to follow these recommendations.

Are perimeter hedges, fences and gates in good repair? Consider your boundary security, keep fences, hedges and ditches in good condition. Repair any holes and gaps and cut back overhanging tree limbs which could be used as a climbing aid to gain unauthorised access.

If considering new fencing, where possible, avoid chain link which is inherently weak. Welded mesh is preferable. Regularly check your gates and locks for evidence of tampering or damage. Use quality **close shackle** padlocks. Refer to www.Soldsecure.com for recommended manufacturers.

Are there places where individuals could hide themselves from view? Consider removing obstructions, places of concealment and recessed areas near stores and sheds. Consider installing lighting where it will increase your chances, or that of a neighbour or a passer-by, of detecting criminal activity. Lighting installed in a remote or very rural location will only however aid an offender.

Are your tools secured within your sheds? Inside the shed consider securing your tools to a ground anchor or through their handles to a 'shed shackle' or other similar security anchor point. Please bear in mind that the chains and padlocks used should be secure and fit for purpose. Consider an alarm, either battery operated (sold at most police stations) or upgrade an existing house alarm to include the shed.

Are tools easily identifiable? Tools that are obviously marked are difficult for an offender to sell on. Property mark your tools; popular options include obvious marking such as etching or painting, or products like Smartwater and SelectaDNA. Advertise the fact that they are marked with signs or stickers to deter an offender, but make sure you keep a note of serial, make and model numbers and take photographs of any valuable or unique garden ornaments and tools. Register all equipment with a serial number for free on the national database www.immobilise.com. This helps police identify and locate an owner if items are lost or stolen.



Suffolk SAFEKey





Suffolk Constabulary

Shoppers are being warned to remain vigilant after purse thieves struck locally. Two offences took place in Bury St Edmunds, the first at a shop in Cornhill where a purse was stolen from within a handbag. This was followed by an incident where a handbag was discovered to have been stolen from an elderly lady's shopping trolley at a shop in Abbeygate Street. This bag was later found in a bin in the ladies toilet at St Edmundsbury Cathedral. In Stowmarket two thefts took place at different stores in Ipswich Street, where purses were stolen from out of handbags. Finally in Sudbury, another purse was stolen from a handbag in Old Market Place.

The victims of these thefts were predominantly elderly, with one aged in her 90s, two in their 80s and one in her 70s. The other victim was aged in her 30s.

Anyone with information about any of these incidents is asked to contact Suffolk Police on 101 or Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.

Police are offering the following advice to help prevent purse and wallet thefts:

- Wear a shoulder bag across the front of your body
- Always keep your purse out of sight
- Zip up your bag and keep it closed
- Do not leave your bag unattended or on a shopping trolley or pushchair – hold onto it
- If people push or bump into you check your bag immediately
- Keep wallets in front trouser pockets or inside jacket pockets never keep them in a rear trouser pocket or an open jacket pocket

Planning Applications

My own experience as well as the procedures at Mid Suffolk continue to show that if you are considering a building project, pre-application advice and discussion frequently smoothes the path and saves time and money. If you believe you may need planning permission please telephone 01449 724500 and ask for the duty planning officer. They will be able to advise you by telephone or in person whether planning permission will be necessary for your project. If objections are anticipated a pre-application discussion on site may be able to resolve these at the outset. Such a discussion will usually involve the applicant and agent/architect, a planning officer, a representative of the parish council and the district councillor (currently myself).

Do you need advice?


Petition for 30mph zone on Finborough Road
